The line item was reduced, in part, based on first quarter FY 2011-12 spending, but spending during FY 2012-13 appear to align with the higher spending trends during prior fiscal years. The child support enforcement operations and state disbursement unit line items were reduced in FY 2012-13 below the levels necessary to support current on-board staffing and contract requirements. Part of the cause is that DHS is incurring retirement and OPEB charges above what was anticipated. In addition, general fund/general purpose authority is transferred from the employment and training support services line item. There is sufficient authority available in the employment and training support services line item based on lower than anticipated spending related to vehicle repairs and replacement after policy changes enacted in 2013.
