RE: Legislative Transfer Package 2017-1

Attached are legislative transfers proposed by the State Budget Office in a letter dated October 31, 2016. Pursuant to section 393 of the Management and Budget Act, a legislative transfer must be approved by a majority of both the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, with identical funding sources and dollar amounts, in order to become effective. This transfer package is scheduled to be considered by the House Appropriations Committee on Wednesday, November 9, 2016.

There are two basic types of legislative transfers, which have different effects on the overall level of appropriations in the state budget.

A **standard legislative transfer** shifts existing spending authorization between line items in a particular budget area, with no net change in total appropriations. Generally, such transfers are proposed when expenditures are higher than originally anticipated in one line item and lower than anticipated in another. These transfers can represent a shift of GF/GP funding between two line items, or merely a shift of spending authorization from same broad category of funding (federal, restricted, etc.) between the line items.

As shown in the attached table, standard transfers in this package total \$800,000, which will shift 0.0% of total appropriations within the existing FY 2016-17 year-to-date state budget.

A **contingency fund transfer** increases total line item appropriations in a budget area by moving contingency spending authorization from the boilerplate section of a budget act to a specific line item in order to recognize additional federal, private, local, or state restricted revenue that has become available since the original enactment of the budget. Absent the contingency fund transfer mechanism, this type of budget adjustment would be made through a supplemental appropriation bill.

As shown in the attached table, contingency fund transfers in this package total \$980,000, which will increase the FY 2016-17 year-to-date state budget by 0.00%.

This transfer request increases spending authorization for the Medical Marihuana Program by \$680,000 to ensure the program maintains statutory compliance (15 business days to approve or deny an application or renewal upon receipt and 5 business days to issue a card for an approved application or renewal) for processing registry identification cards. The additional funds will be used to add 5 FTEs for the processing of applications, as application volumes have increased significantly over the past 12 months. Sufficient revenues exist in the Michigan Medical Marihuana Fund to support this transfer.

This request transfers \$300,000 of Michigan State Waterways Fund authorization (AY 2014) available in the State Infrastructure Improvement and Land Acquisition line item to the Selfridge Boating Access site, Macomb County line item. This transfer will enable adjustments to the parking lot to accommodate more visitors and accessibility improvements while remaining within the original scope of the project. This transfer is needed no later than the end of calendar year 2016, as seasonal use patterns and weather conditions require construction to be completed by spring 2017, so as not to interfere with the boating season. Both accounts involved in this transfer request are capital outlay accounts that have multi-year authorization authority.

PA 268 of 2016 created the Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency Reserve Fund within DTMB. This state restricted contingency fund transfer would increase the Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency Reserve Fund authorization for the Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency line item, enabling the Department to expend available Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency Reserve Fund revenues in excess of the current authorization. Specifically, the state restricted contingency fund transfer would transfer \$300,000 of the available Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency Reserve Fund revenues in excess of the current authorization. Specifically, the state restricted contingency fund transfer would transfer \$300,000 of the available Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency Reserve Fund balance to provide resources for contractual services of an integrity oversight monitor to perform an overall risk assessment and provide recommendations for a loss prevention strategy with respect to the expenditure of funds related to the Flint emergency. A \$100 Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency placeholder line item was included in the Department of Treasury budget to allow for the potential transfer of funds from the Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency Reserve Fund as needed.
