The House Fiscal Agency's FY 2005-06 ***Directory of State-Administered Grants*** describes and categorizes grants-in-aid available through state departments. In general, grants-in-aid are sums of money from federal, state, local, or private sources which are usually authorized by federal and/or state statutes for specific purposes. Grant funds may be distributed to qualifying units of local government, non-profit organizations, private organizations, educational institutions, or individuals. Before they are distributed, however, the grant funds must be authorized by legislative appropriation.

This ***Directory*** was prepared in response to legislative interest in and requests for information on state-administered grants. Items in this report were reviewed and compiled by House Fiscal Agency analysts from information provided by state departments and agencies.
