BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES

Rule Set 2021-49 LR would add, amend, and rescind numerous rules within the Michigan Energy Code (which applies to buildings and structures) to adopt the 2021 version of the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC). The rule set currently adopts the 2015 version of the IECC, and the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) is required to update the rules every 3 years to coincide with the national code change cycle.

FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES

2021-49 LR would not be anticipated to have a net impact on the revenues or expenditures of LARA or other units of state or local government. LARA did indicate that government units could incur higher initial expenditures, but that these costs would be offset by long-term savings resulting from provisions contained within the rule set. The precise impact would vary due to specific factors on a unit-by-unit basis and is therefore currently indeterminate.
