- St. Clair County Community College (SC4) is located in the city of Port Huron and in the county of St. Clair. SC4's 29-acre campus is in the heart of the action downtown, right on a busy international border and just steps away from the St. Clair River and beautiful shores of Lake Huron.
- SC4's strategic priorities: Growth, sustainability and community.
- 2018 fall semester enrollment: 3,608. Mix of traditional and nontraditional students. In the 2018 fall semester, 37% of all students were in transfer programs of study.
- Dual-enrolled high school and middle college students accounted for 29% of the student population in the 2018 fall semester. In the 2018 fall semester, 329 students were enrolled in health science programs. In the 2017-18 academic year, 18% of all certificates and degrees awarded were in the health science field.
- Founded in 1954, the nursing program at St. Clair County Community College was one of the first associate degree nursing programs in Michigan.
- The Career and Technical Middle College – a new partnership with the St. Clair County Regional Education Service Agency – allows high school students the opportunity to earn an associate degree or certificate program from SC4 at the end of their 13th year.
- SC4 students can easily complete and transfer 30 general education credit requirements thanks to the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), a significant cost savings to students.
