for Wayne State
University

Architect Suren Pilafian
designed and oversaw the
construction of State Hall in 1946

Construction was funded in part by
the State of Michigan

Construction was completed in 1948
and expanded by a second wing in 1955

State Hall is located on Cass
Street, a prominent civic corridor
where the university and city blend
and emerge

The Master Plan recommends
expanding instructional activity in a
renovated State Hall that caters to
a wide range of pedagogies

buildings on campus



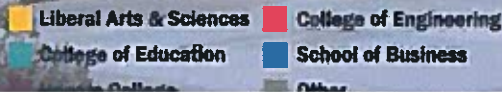
