

Department's Constitutional Priorities*

- 1. Investigate alleged discrimination
- 2. Secure equal protection without discrimination

*As established by Article 5, Section 29 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963

Civil Rights Commission

- Created in 1963 Constitution only one in country to be part of constitution
- 8 members, appointed by the Governor, with advice and consent of the senate, to serve 4-year terms (no more than 4 from any one party)
- Establishes policy
- Selects the Executive Director of the Department

Required MDCR Activities

 - Elliott-Larsen Act

- 4. Division on Deaf, DeafBlind, and Hard of Hearing (DODDBHH)
- 5. Women's Commission
- 6. Service Animal Program
- 7. State Equal Opportunity & Diversity Council (SEODC)
- 8. Interagency Migrant Services Committee (IMSC)
- 9. ADA Compliance

Initiatives

- 1. Advocates & Leaders for Police & Community Trust (ALPACT)
- 2. Collaborating with MCOLES to implement Governor Snyder's Executive Directive relating to fostering public trust in law enforcement.
- 3. Michigan Alliance Against Hate Crimes (MIAAHC)
- 4. Collaboration with MDE on Civil Rights Education

Investigation


- Bulk of the Department's work
- 6 Enforcement Units, located in 3 offices, assist citizens in need.
- Contract with 2 federal agencies to conduct jointly-filed investigations.
- Experienced investigators complete up to 7 investigations per month.
- The MDCR's goal of completing each investigation in less than 180 days was reached in FY15 down from over 300 days in FY11.

In addition, the department:

- Provides mediation services in an effort to bring quicker resolution
- Coordinates conciliation and charge, if warranted
- Presents the case to hearing officer and the Civil Rights Commission for final adjudication.

The Department is required to investigate every properly filed complaint.
