This transfer request would shift \$3.8 million in state restricted funding authorization from the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing and Tracking line item to the Recreational Marihuana Regulation line item, to align with shifting market share from the medical market to the adult-use market. Under this transfer, the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing and Tracking line item would decrease from \$1.6 million to \$7.8 million and the Recreational Marihuana Regulation line item would increase from \$7.4 million. The medical and adult-use programs are respectively supported by state restricted revenues from the Marihuana Regulatory Fund and the Marihuana Regulation Fund. The FY 2022-23 enacted budget includes a similar shift.
