

- These students are on a trajectory to achieve up to 2.4 years of academic growth! At this rate students should have reached one year's worth of expected growth after 22 weeks of instruction.*
- Students using Imagine Math are more than doubling the national expected growth.
- The average growth of this cohort of students is 4.1Q per week. The national expected growth for these grades is 1.7Q per week.



- The Imagine Benchmark Test shows student growth in Literacy skills overall by 10% and in Vocabulary 24%.

Thank you so much for funding Imagine Math for us this year. I would recommend the program and hope it will continue to be funded next year as we have seen many positive impacts from the program:

1. **Differentiation:** Imagine Math differentiates for every student so no matter what background the student is coming from, if the student is on grade level or below, we are seeing the program meeting their needs. Imagine Math also provides our teachers with instructional supports to help their students with specific needs. Live on-demand teaching support is also available through the program so that as students are working at home, in a study hall, or in an after-school program they have access to certified math teachers 7 days/week.
 - a. **Example:** As of this moment I can see that our students have used 874 live teaching sessions. This means they needed help and instantly got access to a certified teacher through Imagine Math.
2. **Data:** The data in the program helps bring transparency to the current skills and growth of the student. It provides real time relevant data to the school teacher, principal, and district administrators. This is invaluable to help us effectively drive instructions and hold staff accountable.
 - a. **Example:** In the first 1/4 of the year we saw 22% of our below-grade level students progress to on grade level in Imagine Math. We are very excited to see the growth after our end of year benchmark.
3. **Motivation:** Imagine Learning provides several different ways for students to get motivated with the program. The kids get very excited about it and for the first time we're seeing students asking to skip recess to stay on Imagine Math and we're hearing about students asking their parents if they can do Imagine Math at home.
 - a. **Example 1:** Students can contribute points earned in the program to a charity of their choice, there are 25 options. So far our students have donated over \$53 to charity, the largest donation being to *Food Bank Council of Michigan*.
 - b. **Example 2:** Imagine Math allows teachers to setup classroom motivation goals and tracks progress for the teacher. There have been 11 classroom goals setup so far. Imagine Math also sponsors monthly competitions just for students using the program in the state of Michigan.







Every teacher strives to reach the needs of each individual student they teach.
