### WMTT Perspective on School Funding

- We support the research compiled by the School Finance Research Collaborative.
- A key part of the research is equitably funding schools, ensuring every child meets their greatest potential.
- We feel the research should guide decision making on funding.



#### **Foundation Grant**

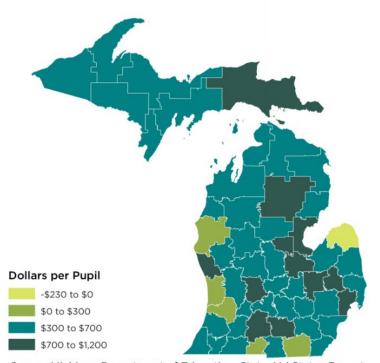


## **Special Education Funding**

- We support additional investment in special education.
- Statewide we have \$742 million in unreimbursed costs for special education.
- Proposed \$60 million increase (\$120 million over two years) to provide additional 4.2 percent reimbursement on 4096 costs; total reimbursement of 32.2 percent.
- Resources go towards covering costs for providing services for children.

#### Student-Centered Funding

- Per the research, we support:
  - Additional funding for at-risk students. Governor recommended an increase of \$60 million.
  - Increased resources for English Learners: \$5 million increase at \$50 per EL student; total of \$18 million.
  - Sec. 31n (with flexibility changes) funding to better meet the mental health needs of students.

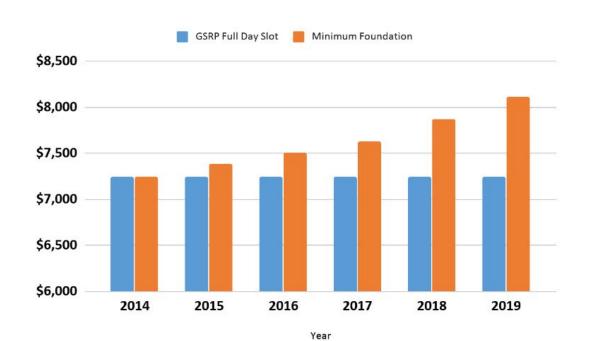


#### Great Start Readiness Program

- Increased funding for the Great Start Readiness Program
  first rate increase since 2014
  - Increase of \$35.5 million for a total of \$285.5 million.
    \$8,336 per full-day experience equal to base foundation allowance.
  - Increased access to early childhood.



## Per Pupil vs. GSRP Funding Full-Day



In 2014 a full-day GSRP experience matched the minimum foundation grant, now it lags behind by \$861 per student.



- Research-based requirements for GSRP make the program more costly to run.
  - Staffing, class size, etc.
- Unlike K-12 students, GSRP doesn't receive additional funding in the form of at-risk funding, federal funds, etc. All funding sources per K-12 student equates to \$11,256.



- Additionally we support:
  - Sec. 147 MPSERS funding to offset increasing costs in our retirement system.
  - Support for infrastructure grants via the General Fund.
