- This proposal supports hiring new crime analysts, support staff, and associated costs – 9 FTEs
- Currently the department provides dedicated patrols, investigators, and community service troopers (CSTs) in Flint, Saginaw, and Detroit, as well as limited patrols in the communities of Pontiac, Inkster, and Muskegon Heights.
- This investment results in analysts, additional directed patrols, and investigators working in the communities of Muskegon Heights, Inkster/Hamtramck/Highland Park/Harper Woods, and Benton Harbor.



INVESTMENT: STATEWIDE DRUG ENFORCEMENT STRATEGY

- This proposal supports hiring crime analysts, data coding operators, and training for multijurisdictional narcotics team members – 9 FTEs.
- The crime analysts will assist the narcotics teams.
- In addition, the department will stand up 2 drug diversion investigative teams; each team consists of 5 enforcement members.
- This initiative allows the department to deploy a statewide drug enforcement strategy which focuses on bolstering analysis and information sharing efforts, combating the illegal diversion and trafficking of prescription drugs, implementing efforts aimed at reducing the demand for illegal drugs, and enhancing training programs for state and local law enforcement personnel actively engaged in drug interdiction efforts.
